Dear Parishioners,

Today a Catholic child is usually sacramentally confirmed about the age of fifteen, during early high school. As young people move beyond their families, they begin to experience new cultures, behaviors, and beliefs,

along with different lifestyles and loyalties. Mature young teens behave responsibly and in such a way that they no longer need to explain their actions, whether good or bad or indifferent; they no longer need their parents to defend their behavior. At this time, as adolescents learn to drive, face new groups, feel their sexuality more intensely, and begin some employment, they need a strong inner core and philosophy that will help them make sense of their changing lives.

During the catechetical studies leading up to Confirmation, the adolescent can review important articles of faith and can raise questions and discuss issues with a supportive teacher and a group of interested peers. Yet, not all young teens of the same age have the same level of maturity and interest in their faith. Nevertheless, it's a good time for concepts to be solidified and for the students to ask questions, for these same students to stand on their own as mature Catholic Christians, and to either set themselves foursquare with parents who do take their Catholic faith seriously, or to find the path to religious practice, spirituality, and faith themselves if their parents are Catholics in name only and not in actual practice. It is indeed a time of synthesis before jumping off into full-fledged adolescence.
