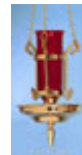

Dear Parishioners,

The sacrament of the Anointing of the Sick was called Extreme Unction (last anointing), not because it was the last sacrament you received before checking out of this life but because it was the last anointing a person received. Baptism and Confirmation were the first two times a person would've been anointed. For deacons, priests, and bishops, the third, fourth, and fifth times, respectively, would come between Confirmation and possible sacramental Anointing of the Sick. Anointing of the Sick was commonly called Last Rites before the reforms of Vatican Council in the 1960s, because before antibiotics and penicillin, more people died than recovered from disease and injury.

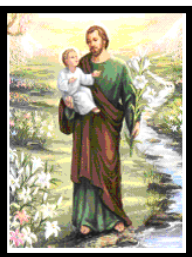
Modern medicine has given people tremendous hope for recovery and remission from diseases, and many surgeries are quite successful, unlike the days before blood transfusions when leeches were applied to suck blood out of a person or veins were deliberately bled to rid the body of so-called "bad humors" and before the advent of sterile instruments, quarantines, and anesthesia. Back then, when sickness or injury usually resulted in death, Catholics called for the priest to anoint sacramentally based on St. James' Epistle: "Are there any sick among you? Then let them send for the priests and let the priest pray over them, anointing them with oil" (James 4:14). Too often, relatives of the dying wait until the last minute, literally, to summon a priest and are distraught when the person dies before the priest can rush to the bedside or is available at a moment's notice.
