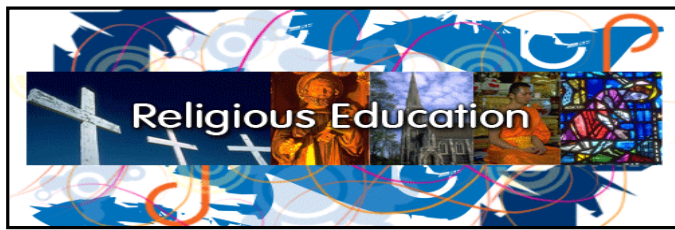

## NEW REGISTRANTS 2013-2014 SCHOOL YEAR

If you are a *new parishioner* and wish to register your children for our program, please call the religious education office at 732-264-7043 to make an appointment.

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

1. Family **MUST** first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
2. Registration (**in person**) at the religious education office (At school).
3. **Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).**
4. A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.  
**1 CHILD \$100 2 CHILDREN \$150  
 3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$180.00**
5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
6. Grades 3 through 7 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
7. The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.

Classes begin on Tuesday, September 17, & Wednesday, September 18, 2013. *Re-registrations are now closed for the 2013-2014 school year.*

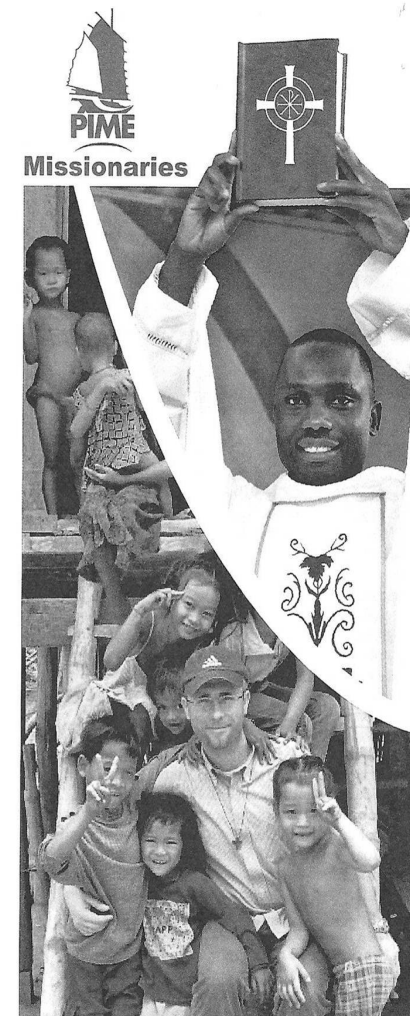

## **Mission Appeal Weekend July 13 & 14**

Fr. George Berendt, PIME, will be coming to our parish to present the Mission Appeal on behalf of the PIME Missionaries the weekend of July 13 & 14. Fr. George Berendt was born in Detroit, MI. He was ordained a PIME Priest in 1974. His mission assignment was to minister to the people in Japan and returned to the United States in 1984. He has been working in many mission locations since then.

The PIME Missionaries are Catholic priests and brothers who commit themselves to lifelong missionary



service, especially to non-Christians. (PIME stands for the Pontifical Institute for Foreign Missions in Latin.) Founded in Italy in 1850, PIME is an International Society of Apostolic Life with members serving in Algeria, Bangladesh, Brazil, Cambodia, Cameroon, Guinea-Bissau, Hong Kong, India, Italy, Ivory Coast, Japan, Mexico, Myanmar, Papua New Guinea, the Philippines, Thailand and the United States.



## ***Ministry Help Needed***

### ***ADORATION***

*This ministry distributes the Holy Eucharist to residents of Regency Nursing Home on the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> Sunday after the 9:00AM Mass, to individuals who are homebound and request to receive the Eucharist at their home once a week or once a month during the day, or to those who are in hospital and are brought the Eucharist on Monday mornings. Volunteers bring smiles and hope to the sick and elderly. Ministers are on rotating schedules.*

### ***COMPASSION MINISTRY***

*Individuals who feel suited to this ministry bring understanding, sympathy and consolation to those suffering from the loss of a loved one. The minister meets with the family in preparation of the funeral liturgy.*

### ***RELIGIOUS EDUCATION***

*If you share the conviction of bringing the faith to our elementary school age children this may be the ministry for you. Teachers and assistants are needed during Tuesday late afternoon sessions, Wednesday late afternoon and evening sessions see this week's bulletin for additional information on this program).*

### ***RCIA-Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults***

*RCIA team members provide instruction for adults who desire to receive the sacraments of baptism, communion and/or confirmation. The team is comprised of religious and lay adults who feel a special connection to those who wish to actively begin or advance their faith journey in the Catholic Church.*
