Dear Parishioners,

It was reported that in the mid-1950s Catholic Church regular attendance at Mass was at a high of 62%. In 1960 there were approximately 180 million Americans. In 2011 the population of the USA is put at roughly 305 million, with millions more off the national census grid as illegal aliens. In 1960 there

were about 44 million US Catholics; in 2010 the number was put at 76 million American Catholics. In 1960 there were about 45,000 priests (90% of whom were born in the United States, the remaining 10% mostly born and raised and educated in Ireland) with 110,000 nuns and Sisters. 2010 has 39,000 priests (some 77% of whom are American born) and about 59,000 vowed women religious. Now national statistics the average of regular Catholic attendance at just about half that mid-fifties 62%, at 32%, comparable to Protestants' attendance at weekly Sunday services, with some denominations of Protestant churches having serious decline in numbers (usually the so-called "mainline Protestant" churches) and others (the less liturgically-oriented and generally "feel good" evangelical and often independent churches) a growth during the past three decades.

That 32% of people who responded to the query as to whether they go to Mass at a regular basis is not reflected in customary autumn count estimates and is closer to 25% on a national basis in the US. Catholics who live in the Midwestern states (e.g., Ohio, Michigan, Indiana, Illinois, Wisconsin, Minnesota, North Dakota, South Dakota, Iowa, Kansas, and Missouri) have a much higher percentage of attendance and active involvement in their church parishes than do Catholics in states from Maryland north to Maine, and the typical Midwestern American Catholic takes for granted that he or she often has to drive many, many more miles than the average three-and-one-half miles to church that separate our parishes in coastal northern Monmouth County. We older Catholics now in Monmouth County who were brought up in places like Brooklyn or Jersey City or Newark or Staten Island no longer just have a few blocks to walk to the church of our choice or our ethnicity for Mass with its 3 or 4 priests per parish. In the eastern coastal urban and semi-urban areas of the Northeast such as the north coastal Monmouth County parish churches from Aberdeen in the west to the edge of human habitation in the east, i.e., Sea Girt, the average of registered Catholics who attend and sometimes actively participate in the prayers and gestures and music and spirituality at Mass is perhaps between 14% to 16%, or at least only here at Holy Family Parish with its roughly 14,000 Catholics. A parish such as ours officially and canonically covers Union Beach and north central Hazlet. We can seat about 600 people in our church; we average (according to my rough estimation, i.e., more or less) 290 attendees per Mass over 6 weekend Masses, thus, I would hazard a guess, putting our number of regularly participating weekend Mass parishioners at 1,740. We have responsible volunteers helping out at Masses in the roles of lectors, Eucharistic ministers, ushers, altar servers, and counters who faithfully fulfill their volunteer obligations at Mass, and a small but persistent minority who leave us scrambling at times for replacements in the aforementioned roles of service.

Are six Masses on weekends necessary? No, they are not.

Thanks to all who serve our church community so faithfully, week after week, days after day, and God bless you all.
