Dear Parishioners,

On the occasion of our bishop's first year as Bishop of Trenton on December 1, 2011, Bishop David M. O'Connell, CM, was interviewed in a recent issue of our Trenton diocesan newspaper, The Monitor. Here are selected question-and-answer excerpts:

<u>Monitor</u> --- Has anything surprised or disappointed you in the past year?

Bishop --- "Not too much. I was surprised by the expectation of some people that, because I was new, I was going to change the teaching or canon law of the Church or established diocesan policies. I have no authority to do the former and I have no reason to do the latter. I am often asked to overturn decisions made by pastors in parishes. I have no reason to do that either. People's expectations can be larger than life and sometimes folks do not realize the implications of what they are asking me. Very few. I guess the only real Disappointments? disappointment is how totally lacking in civility and respect, how hurtful and hateful some people can be in their correspondence --- of course, usually anonymously. I have stopped reading anonymous letters and I don't respond to the nasty ones."

<u>Monitor</u> --- What has been your greatest satisfaction? <u>Bishop</u> --- ''Meeting so many of the faithful and sensing their desire to be good Catholics.''
