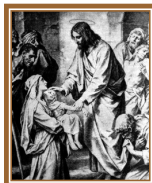

Dear Parishioners,

The Church advises Catholics to avoid sin, receive the sacraments, pray, and do good works because how they live their lives here on earth will influence what happens to them in the afterlife. Death brings a separation of the soul from the body; but it not an end of existence. Immediately after death, the soul of the departed is subject to a particular judgment.

Depending on how a person has lived her or his life, he or she will go to Heaven, where she or he will be immersed in God, or as most would say, have the "vision of God"; to Purgatory, where she or he will go through a purification or purging process before being allowed the full experience of God; or to Hell, where God is not. At the final judgment (the end of the world), the "Parousia" or Second Coming of Christ, all the just will be reunited with their glorified bodies, to live forever in glory with God.

The Church denies predestination. Men and women have free will to choose a life of virtue or to turn away from God and live a life of sin. No one is predestined for Hell or Heaven, as the radical Protestant Reformation demagogue John Calvin would have people believe. God is loving and merciful and will forgive the most serious of sins up to the last moment of a person's life --- provided the person is truly repentant --- even if only to avoid winding up in Hell and not out of love of God or his or her fellow men and women. However, hardened sinners who do not seek repentance cannot take advantage of God's mercy. To say, "I am saved because I believe in Jesus Christ as my Lord and Savior," as some Christians believe, is not enough. Faith must be accompanied by good works and a life unselfishly lived. Yes, Jesus does save. We are redeemed by Jesus, each and every one of us, but we each are yet to experience salvation when we die to this life.
