PALM SUNDAY OF THE PASSION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Isaiah 50:4-7

In a tone of quiet sadness, Isaiah describes the buffets and insults given to the Suffering Servant. The passage ends on a note of hope.

Second Reading: Philippians 2:6-11

In exultant tones, Paul tells the Philippians to rejoice because Christ became man, died on the cross, rose from the dead, and sits triumphantly at the right hand of the Father.

Gospel: Matthew 26:14—27:66

This is the solemn narrative of the passion and death of our Lord Jesus Christ. Matthew recounts the treachery and betrayal of Judas and then describes the events of the Last Supper, culminating in the institution of the Eucharist. Jesus endures the Agony in the Garden; he is then brought before Caiaphas and Pilate and condemned to death. After His resurrection, the centurions shouted, "Clearly this was the Son of God!"

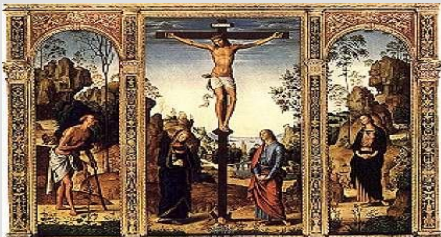

Easter Food Basket Blessing

There is a custom in Poland for families to bring baskets of food to church to be blessed by the priest on Holy Saturday. We have continued this custom here at Holy Family. There will be a blessing of food for the Easter meal on Sat. April 19th at 12 Noon (Holy Saturday). The baskets usually contain colored eggs (that symbolize life, spring, and the Resurrection), sausage or ham (that represents the passion of Christ), bread or Babka (that represents Christ, who is the bread of life), horseradish (representing the passion of Christ), salt (symbolizing prosperity), and butter (that represents good will).

The Origin of the Gospels, Monday evenings, 7:30 - 9:00 pm, April 28, May 5, May 12 and May 19

There is always some controversy or another that emerges over the history and tradition of the Gospels as found in the New Testament. Popular novels, movies and TV documentaries offer interesting, and usually erroneous speculation regarding all aspects of the New Testament: how many Gospels there are, how authentic they are, and about the "missing" Gospels. Here we will explore the history behind the writing of the Gospels and the formation of the canon of Gospel literature as found in the New Testament. The cost is \$30 for the series, checks payable to Fr. Garry Koch, due the first night of class. Space is limited to the first 40 participants.

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION

Parents with children in our religious education program received their re-registration forms **by hand from their children (check their folders) last week April 8th or 9th**, for the 2014-2015 school year. Please make any necessary corrections, **SIGN** and return the form, including the non-refundable registration fee, **or promissory note by May 29, 2014.**



NEW DIOCESAN REQUIREMENT : SIGNED registrations ONLY will be accepted, for each child. DO NOT MAIL REGISTRATION TO THE SCHOOL use P.O. BOX ONLY. You may also send it in through your child on April 22-23 or drop it off to our **SCHOOL** office May 5th thru June 30th, call for hours. **CLOSED FRIDAYS** Front door, ring bell. **Fees increase June 2nd thru June 30th. Absolutely no re-registrations will be taken after June 30th, your child will have to wait for the 2015-16 year.**

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE TAKEN BY PHONE.

Classes begin in September. First grade begins Sunday, October 5, 2014. *No other notice will be sent home to you.* Class assignments will be posted on those days. Please read your letters carefully!

NEW REGISTRANTS

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

- Family **MUST** first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
- Registration (in person) at the religious education office (At school).
- Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).
- A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.

1 CHILD \$100.00 2 CHILDREN \$150.00
3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$180.00

- A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
- Grades 3 through 8 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.

The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.
