FOURTH SUNDAY OF EASTER

First Reading: Acts 2:14a, 36-41

With great authority, Peter proclaims to the people that the Christ who was crucified is indeed the Messiah. Urging them to reform and be baptized in the name of Christ, three thousand responded to his words and were baptized.

Second Reading: 1 Peter 2:20b-25

This is a strong exhortation from Peter to the people to endure suffering for Christ as he did for them. Healed by his wounds, they have "returned to the shepherd."

Gospel: John 10:1-10

Christ uses the beautiful image of the shepherd to describe his care for his sheep. He also says he is the sheepgate and promises that "Whoever enters through me will be safe."

St. Joseph is the patron saint of the happy death, and in the Hail Mary Catholics beseech Mary to "pray for us now and at the hour of our death."

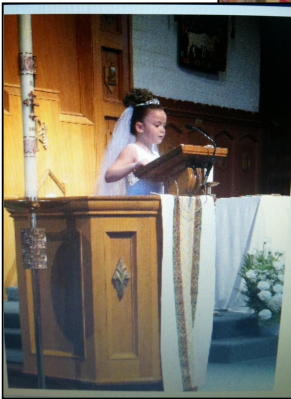

RE-REGISTRATIONS**

Parents with children in our religious education program received their re-registration forms **by hand from their children for the 2014-2015 school year**. Please make any necessary corrections, **SIGN** and return the form, including the non-refundable registration fee, **or promissory note by May 29, 2014: SIGNED registrations ONLY will be accepted, for each child. DO NOT MAIL REGISTRATION TO THE SCHOOL use P.O. BOX ONLY.** You may also drop it off to our **SCHOOL** office (Front door, ring bell) May 5th thru June 30th, **call for hours. CLOSED FRIDAYS** Fees increase June 2nd thru June 30th. **Absolutely no re-registrations will be taken after June 30. Your child will have to wait for the 2015-16 year. NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE TAKEN BY PHONE.**

Re-registrations Continued:

Classes begin on Tuesday September 16th or Wednesday, September 17th 2014, or shortly thereafter, depending on your child's grade. First grade begins Sunday, October 5, 2014. No other notice will be sent home to you. Class assignments will be posted on those days. **PLEASE READ YOUR LETTERS CAREFULLY!**

NEW REGISTRANTS

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

1. Family **MUST** first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
2. Registration (**in person**) at the religious education office (At school).
3. **Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).**
4. A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child:
**1 CHILD \$100 2 CHILDREN \$150
3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$180.00**
5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
6. Grades 3 through 8 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
7. The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.
