Gospel: Matthew 16:13-19



RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION Parents with children in our religious education program should re-register <u>their children</u> for the 2014-2015 school year by June 30th. Please make any necessary corrections, <u>SIGN</u> and return the form, including the non-refundable registration fee, plus increase as of June 2, <u>or promissory</u> note which had been included: SIGNED registrations <u>ONLY will be accepted, for each child.</u> <u>DO NOT MAIL</u> <u>REGISTRATION TO THE SCHOOL use P.O. BOX</u> <u>ONLY.</u> You may also drop it off to our <u>SCHOOL</u> office (Front door, ring bell) thru June 30th, <u>call for hours</u>. <u>CLOSED FRIDAYS Fees increased June 2nd thru June</u> <u>30th</u>. Absolutely no re-registrations will be taken after June 30th, your child will have to wait for the 2015-16 year.

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE TAKEN BY PHONE.

Classes begin on Tuesday September 16th or Wednesday September 17th 2014, or shortly thereafter, depending on your child's grade. First grade begins Sunday, October 5, 2014. NEW REGISTRANTS

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

- 3. Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).
- 4. A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.

- 5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
- 6. Grades 3 through 8 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
- 7. The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.





Peter and Paul



Today we are celebrating the feast of Saints Peter and Paul. They are such important saints that their feast day takes the place of the usual Sunday. Saint Peter was the chief of the Apostles. He was close to Our Lord, and the only one

that Jesus told, "you are Peter (which means rock) and on this rock I will build my Church..." Saint Peter had a hard time accepting that Jesus had to die, and he also denied Jesus. But he was sorry afterward and became a strong leader for the disciples after Jesus went back into Heaven. Saint Peter was the Church's first pope.

Saint Paul was a Jew who at first was against the Christians. He even helped to persecute them. But then Jesus appeared to him and Paul became a Christian and a great preacher. His mission was to preach to the Gentiles, the people who didn't know about God or His promises. He wrote many letters that are now part of the Bible.

Both Saint Peter and Saint Paul preached and taught about Jesus and brought the Faith to many people and places. But the Roman government did not like the Christians. The emperor Nero began killing the Christians, and among those killed were Peter and Paul. Their deaths didn't stop the Church from growing, though. When people die for God it brings even more grace into the Church.

Today we should thank God for sending us these great saints, and we can also pray that we will help to spread the Faith.


