EASTER SUNDAY OF THE RESURRECTION OF THE LORD

First Reading: Acts 10:34a, 37-43

In this passage, Peter testifies that he and his followers saw the miracles performed by Christ, witnessed His death, and believe in His resurrection. Now they will proclaim to all that Christ is the Son of God.

Second Reading: Colossians 3:1-4

Paul tells the Colossians that they will appear with Christ in glory. They should be mindful of things above rather than things on earth.

Gospel: John 20:1-9

In vivid detail, John tells us that when Mary Magdalene visited Christ's tomb, the tomb was empty. She told the apostles, who ran to the tomb, and saw the "wrappings" on the ground. The disciple who entered first "saw and believed."

An Easter Prayer

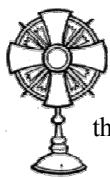


*Risen Lord, you are our resurrection and life!

RELIGIOUS EDUCATION REGISTRATION

Parents with children in our religious education program received their re-registration forms by hand from their children (check their folders) the week of **April 8, for the 2014-2015 school year.** Please make any necessary corrections, **SIGN** and return the form, including the non-refundable registration fee, **or promissory note by May 29, 2014.**



NEW DIOCESAN

REGISTRATION TO THE SCHOOL use P.O. BOX ONLY. You may also send it in through your child on April 22-23 or drop it off to our **SCHOOL** office May 5th thru June 30th, call for hours. **CLOSED FRIDAYS** Front door, ring bell. **Fees increase June 2nd thru June 30th.** **Absolutely no re-registrations will be taken after June 30th, your child will have to wait for the 2015-16 year.**

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE TAKEN BY PHONE.

Classes begin in September. First grade begins Sunday, October 5, 2014. No other notice will be sent home to you. Class assignments will be posted on those days. Please read your letters carefully!

NEW REGISTRANTS

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

- Family **MUST** first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
- Registration (in person) at the religious education office (At school).
- Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).
- A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.

1 CHILD \$100.00 2 CHILDREN \$150.00
3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$180.00

- A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
- Grades 3 through 8 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.

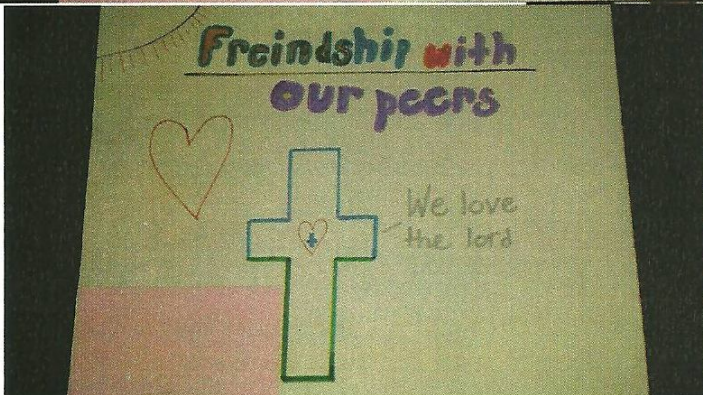
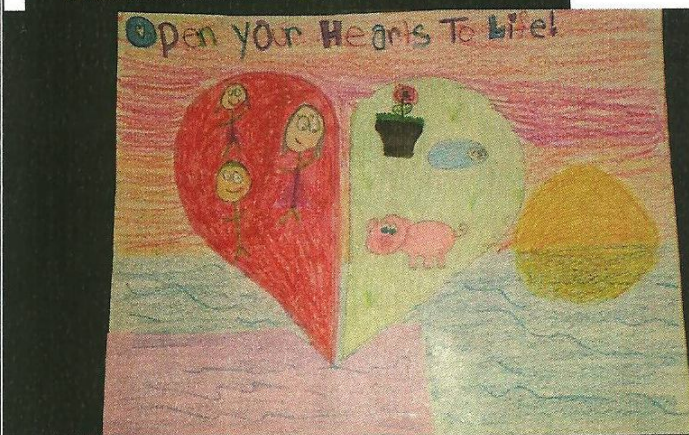
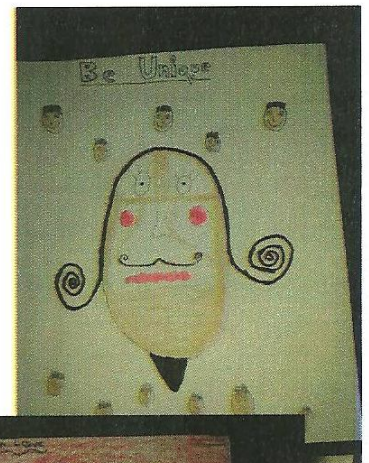
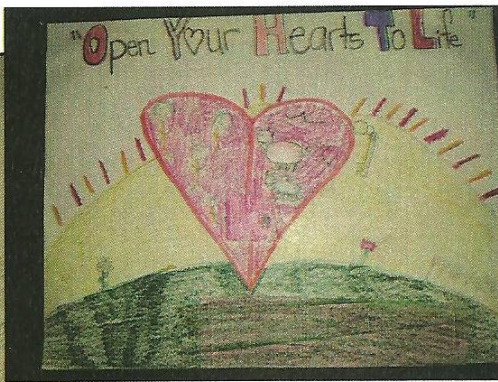
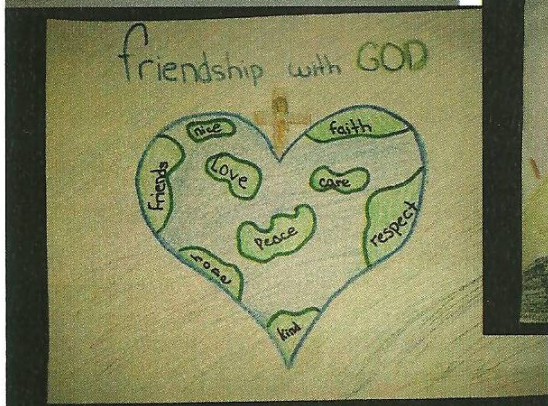
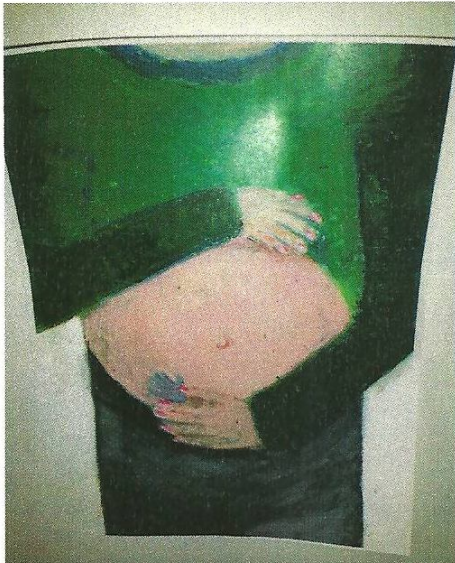
The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.

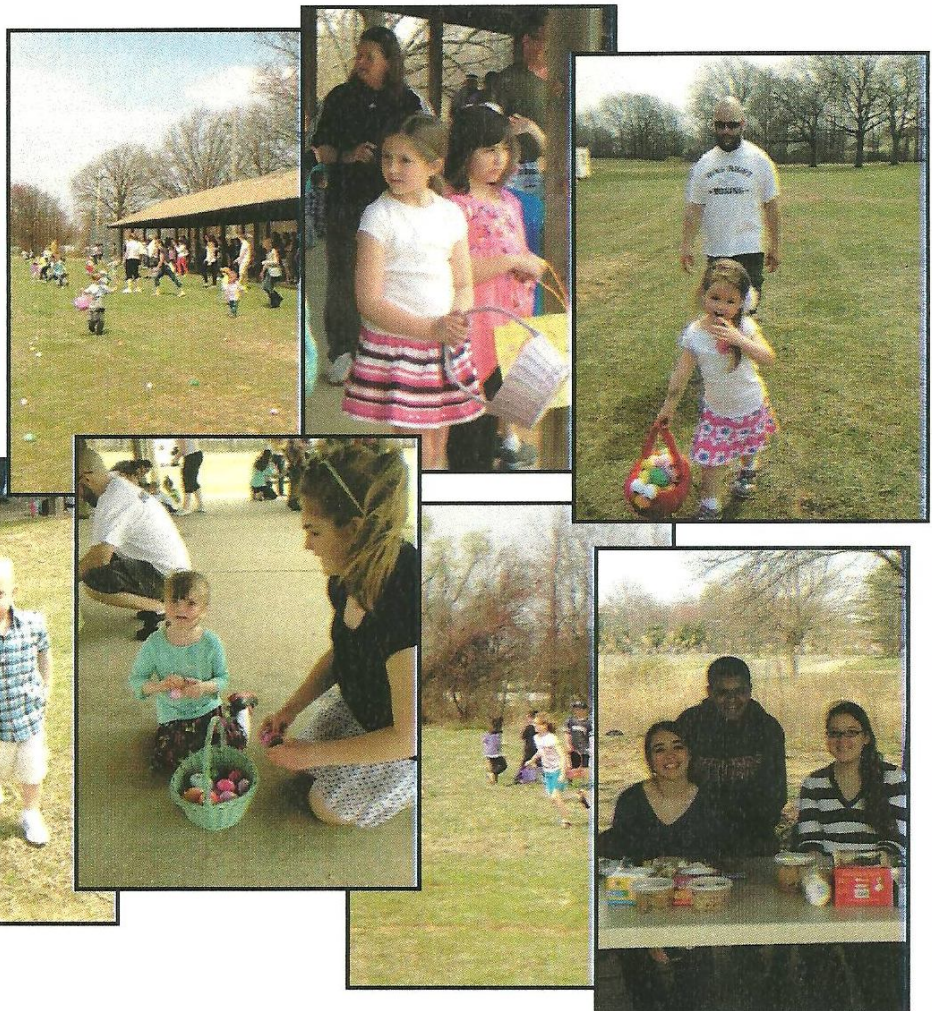


Holy Family's Second Annual
