SECOND SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: 1 Samuel 3:3b-10, 19

This powerful story describes Samuel, who at the time was the servant of the high priest. The Lord called out to Samuel, who twice thought Eli had called him. They gradually realized that it was the Lord who called for him. So the third time Samuel answered and the Lord remained with Samuel as he grew.

Second Reading: 1 Corinthians 6:13c-15a, 17-20

Paul explains to the Corinthians that their body is a temple of the Holy Spirit. He tells them to avoid lewd conduct, and glorify God by keeping their bodies pure.

Gospel: John 1:35-42

John told two of his disciples that Jesus is the Lamb of God. They turned and followed him, immediately curious and attracted to him. Andrew told his brother Simon about Jesus. Simon also came to meet Jesus, who renamed him Cephas, or Peter.

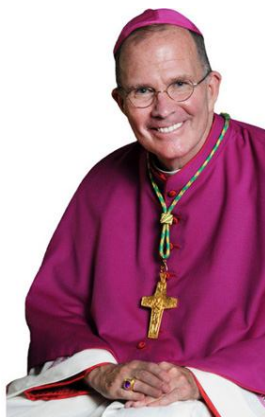

The parish offices will be closed on Monday January 19 in honor of Martin Luther King's Birthday.



Bishop David M. O'Connell, C.M., Diocese of Trenton, underwent surgery, Dec. 29, in a Trenton area hospital to remove his left foot, ankle and part of his lower left leg reaching halfway between the knee and the ankle. The surgery was needed to address several serious infections brought about by diabetes.

Bishop O'Connell's surgery was described as successful by his surgeons, and his recovery is going well. He will remain in the hospital for a brief period of observation, and then will be moved to a local rehabilitation center. He is expected to make a full recovery, and will be fitted for a prosthesis at a time to be determined by his doctors.

We ask members of the community to pray for Bishop O'Connell in the coming weeks and months, as he recovers and completes his rehabilitation. Anyone wishing to send a card or note may do so at the following address:

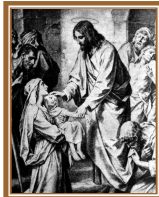

We ask that you please register in the parish office anytime between 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Thursday and between 9 a.m. and 2 p.m. Fridays. We hope you will become involved in one of our many ministries here at Holy Family. Please feel free to contact the parish office with any questions or concerns you may have at 732-264-1484.

Below are just some of the ministries you may be interested in participating in:

- **Adult Altar Server Ministry** – Assist our parish priest with funerals – usually morning hours.
- **Choir Ministry** – Do you like to sing? The choir practices every Wednesday at 7:30 p.m. in the church choir loft and sings at the 11 a.m. Mass each Sunday and on special Holy Days of the year.
- **Youth Choir** – Ages 7 to 18. Sings on designated Sundays at the 9 a.m. Children's Mass. Please arrive 15 minutes before Mass for practice.
- **Altar & Rosary Society** – Women 18 and older are invited to join this ministry which meets every fourth Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. in Memorial Hall for prayer, taking care of the altar, fellowship, fundraisers, etc.
- **Compassion Ministry** – Assist those whose are grieving in choosing their readings and music and notating ways their loved ones are remembered.
- **Golden Age Group** – Young adults 55 and up are invited to Memorial Hall on alternate Monday mornings to join in fellowship, trips, bingo socials, and more.
- **Altar Server Ministry** – Grades 3 and up assist our Priests at Mass, Funerals, and weddings.
- **Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist** – Distribute the Eucharist during Mass.
- **Usher Ministry** – Assist in taking collection, seating, and greeting our parishioners and visitors.
- **Tarscisius Ministry** – Volunteers take Communion to the shut-ins and the hospital.
- **Religious Education Program** – You may volunteer as an aid, teacher, assist in baking goods for fundraisers, etc.
- **St. Vincent de Paul Ministry** – Volunteers assist in the food pantry, thrift shop, making calls to those in need, or delivering food.
- **High School Youth Ministry** – All high school aged teens are invited to join this ministry that meets every Sunday at 6 p.m. in Memorial Hall. Our teens get involved in service projects, fellowship, trips, fundraisers, etc.
- **Wednesday Adoration** – 8:30 a.m. to 3p.m. Come and sit in silent reflection before the Lord in the Blessed Sacrament anytime from 8:30 until 3p.m. Cast all your cares on Him as He loves you so much!

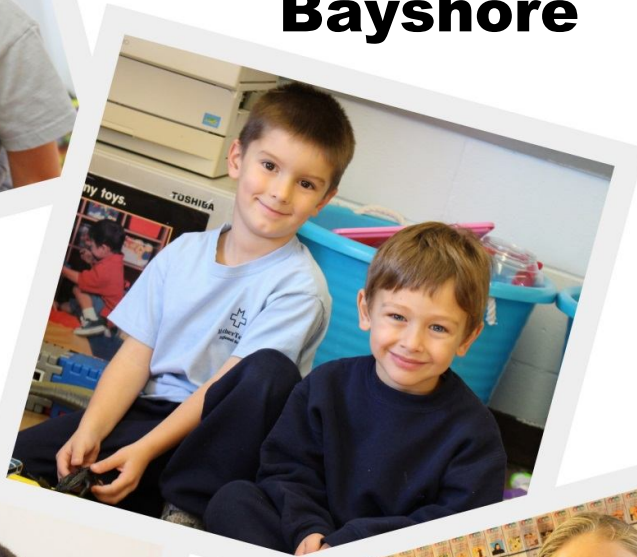

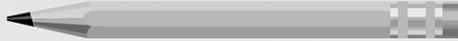
