TWENTY-SEVENTH SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

First Reading: Isaiah 5:1-7

This passage about the failure of the Lord's vineyard is a metaphor for the ingratitude of the people of Israel and Judah. In tones of sadness and rebuke, the Lord asks, "What more was there to do for my vineyard?"

Second Reading: Philippians 4:6-9

In a moving appeal to the Philippians, Paul exhorts them to embrace all that is pure, decent, and admirable; then God's peace will be theirs.

Gospel: Matthew 21:33-43

In another rebuke to the chief priests and the elders, Jesus recounts a parable in which the owner of a vineyard leases his vineyard to tenant farmers. When the owner sends his servants and even his son to claim his rightful share of the crops, the tenants kill all of them. With some bitterness, Jesus warns the chief priests that "the Kingdom of God will be taken away from you and given to people that will yield a rich harvest.

Parish Registration

We welcome you if you are a new member to the parish and invite you to register at the Rectory Office. *We encourage you to share in a parish ministry program.* You may register at Holy Family in a variety of ways including picking up the form in the rectory or filling the form out online and either mailing it to the rectory, dropping it in the collection basket or hand delivering it to the rectory.

Become a Registered Parishioner

One of the most important things that the people of a parish should do is register. Registering for the parish not only makes you more a part of the family of Holy Family and the Church it gives a chance for you and your family to be counted and heard in the parish.

Some important reasons to register are the following:

Sponsor Certificates – when you are asked to be a sponsor for either Baptism or Confirmation you need a letter signed from your pastor stating that you are a practicing Catholic. If you are not registered in the parish, it is not possible for the pastor to sign these forms.

Marriage- For marriage preparation and marriage a letter may be needed from your pastor to allow you to get married in another parish or church.

Funerals- When burying a loved one in a catholic cemetery without a funeral mass it is necessary to get priest lines. Unfortunately, the pastor needs to know if a parishioner was a

registered member before he can officially sign the documents. **Mailings** – You will receive all parish mailings with regards to special events and announcements.

Contributions – registered parishioners receive weekly envelopes to assist with the day-to-day operations of the parish. These are just a few of the ways that being a registered parishioner can make your experience a better one at Holy Family.

Parish Ministry Programs

Holy Family Parish offers a number of ways to become active in parish ministry. Please contact us at the parish office to volunteer or for more information on any of the following ministries:

- Altar Server Ministry Children in Grades 3 and up are invited to assist our priests at Mass, funerals, and weddings.
- Adult Altar Server Ministry Adult men and women assist our parish priests with funerals (morning hours).
- Altar & Rosary Society Women 18 and older are invited to join this ministry which meets the fourth Thursday of the month at 7 p.m. in Memorial Hall (Sept. through June).
- Choir Ministry The choir sings at the 11 a.m. Sunday Mass and on Holy Days.
- **Compassion Ministry** Meets with family members in preparation for their loved one's funeral Mass. Providing guidance in choosing readings, music, and notating special memories.
- Eucharistic Adoration Ministry Commit to keeping our Lord company in the Blessed Sacrament for one hour between 9:00 a.m. and 12 noon every Wednesday.
- Extraordinary Ministers of the Eucharist Assists the priest in distributing the Eucharist during Mass.
- Golden Age Ministry Adults 55+ gather biweekly for fellowship and various activities.
- Homebound Ministry Takes the Eucharist on a weekly basis to our parishioners who are no longer able to attend Mass with us.
- **Reader Ministry** Proclaim God's word at Mass.
- Religious Education Teacher/Assistant Ministry – Volunteers assist in teaching our parish children the faith as teachers, assistants.
- St. Vincent de Paul Ministry Volunteers assist in the food pantry, thrift shop, making calls to those in need, or delivering food.
- **Tarscisius Ministry** Volunteers take the Eucharist to those in area nursing homes every other weekend following the 9:30 a.m. Mass.
- **Hospital Ministry** Volunteer groups alternate every other Monday taking the Eucharist to our Catholic brothers and sisters in Bayshore Hospital, Holmdel.
- **Usher Ministry** Volunteers welcome our parishioners and friends as they enter/leave the church, assist in seating, take up the collections during Mass, and distribute bulletins when the Mass is over.

100th ANNIVERSARY OF FATIMA OUR LADY'S SIXTH & LAST APPARITION



On 13, October 1917 the children surrounded by a crowd of 70,000 persons under a torrential rain, Lucy asked again of the Lady: "What do you want from me?" she answered:

'I AM THE LADY OF THE ROSARY, I DESIRE HERE A CHAPEL IN MY HONOR TO BE BUILT, THAT PEOPLE

CONTINUE TO RECITE THE ROSARY EVERY DAY. Will the war finish? THE WAR IS GOING TO END, AND THE SOLDIERS WILL SOON RETURN TO THEIR HOMES." Then Lucy asked: "may I ask you for cures and conversions, will you grant them?" "SOME YES, OTHERS NO. IT IS NECESSARY THAT THEY ASK PARDON FOR THEIR SINS, THAT THEY DON'T OFFEND GOD OUR LORD AND THAT HE IS ALREADY TOO MUCH OFFENDED. "Do you want anything else from me?" Lucy asked. 'I DO NOT WANT ANYTHING MORE."

Then She opened her hands again and She launched a ray of light in the direction of the sun as Lucy shouted that they should look at the sun. At this point the promised sign happened, Lucy shouted to look at the sun, the rain stopped suddenly and there appeared an exceptionally bright sun but not dazzling. The sun began to turn as if projecting in each direction bands of light of each color that lit and colored the clouds, the sky, the trees, and the crowd. It stayed for some moments then it went back to its normal position, it stayed still for a small while and then it happened again. Suddenly it looked as it it stood out from the sky to fall headlong on the crowd, that was looking terrorized, they fell to their knees and begged mercy. Meanwhile, the children saw a Lady dressed like the white of the sun with a blue cape, St. Joseph with the Child Jesus that blessed the world. Then after this vision they saw The Lord bless the world, standing next to our Lady of Sorrows. After these visions the Lady of Mt. Carmel finished the miracle. As the people regained their senses they noticed still another miracle. Although it had been a very rainy day now the ground and even their clothes were dry.

One of the principal anti-clerical publications of the day was O Dia, a major Lisbon newspaper. On October 17th, O Dia reported the following: At one o'clock in the afternoon, midday by the sun, the rain stopped, the sky, pearly gray in color, illuminated the vast arid landscape with a strange light. The sun had a transparent gauzy veil so that eyes could easily be fixed upon it. The gray mother-of-pearl tone turned into a sheet of silver which broke up as the clouds were torn apart and the silver sun, enveloped in the same gauzy gray light, was seen to whirl and turn in the circle of broken clouds. A cry went up from every mouth and people fell on their knees on the muddy ground. The light turned a beautiful blue as if it had come through the stained-glass windows of a cathedral and spread itself over the people who knelt with outstretched hands. The blue faded slowly and then the light seemed to pass through yellow glass. Yellow stains fell against white handkerchiefs, against the dark skirts of women. They were reported on the trees, on the stones and on the serra. People wept and prayed with uncovered heads in the presence of the miracle they had awaited. The public apparitions ceased but the children. from time to time would still see Our Lady.
