THIRD SUNDAY OF ADVENT

First Reading: Isaiah 61:1-2a, 10-11

Isaiah describes the joy and salvation which will accompany the coming of Christ. He compares the plants which spring from a garden to the justice that will spring from all nations.

Second Reading: 1 Thessalonians 5:16-24

Paul reminds the Thessalonians to constantly ready themselves for Christ's arrival. He tells them to "avoid any semblance of evil" so that they may be found irreproachable when Jesus does arrive.

Gospel: John 1:6-8, 19-28

John explains that he is only a messenger to the people for one more powerful than himself. John stresses to them that they must make a path for the one so powerful that he is not fit to unfasten the strap of his sandal.

Parish Registration

We welcome you if you are a new member to the parish and invite you to register at the Rectory Office. *We encourage you to share in a parish ministry program.* You may register at Holy Family in a variety of ways including picking up the form in the rectory or filling the form out online and either mailing it to the rectory, dropping it in the collection basket or hand delivering it to the rectory.

Become a Registered Parishioner

One of the most important things that the people of a parish should do is register. Registering for the parish not only makes you more a part of the family of Holy Family and the Church it gives a chance for you and your family to be counted and heard in the parish.

Some important reasons to register are the following:

Sponsor Certificates – when you are asked to be a sponsor for either Baptism or Confirmation you need a letter signed from your pastor stating that you are a practicing Catholic. If you are not registered in the parish, it is not possible for the pastor to sign these forms.

Marriage- For marriage preparation and marriage a letter may be needed from your pastor to allow you to get married in another parish or church.

Funerals- When burying a loved one in a catholic cemetery without a funeral mass it is necessary to get priest lines.

Unfortunately, the pastor needs to know if a parishioner was a registered member before he can officially sign the documents. **Mailings** – You will receive all parish mailings with regards to special events and announcements.

Contributions – registered parishioners receive weekly envelopes to assist with the day-to-day operations of the parish. These are just a few of the ways that being a registered parishioner can make your experience a better one at Holy Family.

Eligibility: *This contest is open to students in the Diocese of Trenton only*

- This contest is for K–8 students enrolled in Catholic Grammar Schools, Parish Religious Education and Youth Programs, and Home-Schooled Students.
- There are six entry categories:

Grades K – 2 Posters Grades 3 – 5 Posters Grades 3 – 5 Essays Grades 6 – 8 Posters Grades 6 – 8 Essays Grades 6 – 8 Photo-Meme (*new*)

Contest Rules:

- No group entries- Each entry must be created by one individual student.
- No adult help- All entries must be created in their entirety by the student, him/herself.
- Stay on theme- All entries must reflect the Be Not Afraid theme and must pertain to "Respect Life" issues.
- Include Form- All entries should have a completed and signed Entry Form attached to the back of the poster, essay, or photo-meme.
- Specifications:
 - Posters may be no larger than 20" x 30" and no smaller than 8 ½" x 11". Drawing must be freehand. Collages of magazine pictures or computer-generated drawings are not admissible.
 - Essays must between 400 and 500 words and are to be typed and submitted in PDF format.
 - Photo-Memes must use an original photo including a caption containing the theme "Be Not Afraid". Photo-Memes must be printed out and mailed in. Do not submit electronically.

Deadlines, Judging, and Prizes:

- Entries from <u>schools</u>, <u>religious education</u> or <u>youth programs</u> must be received by the Principal, DRE/CRE, youth minister, or their designee by <u>January 5, 2018</u> for preliminary review in order for the school, religious education or youth program to select one entry from each of the six categories to be submitted to the Diocese for judging. <u>Only ONE entry from each of the six categories listed above may be submitted by a particular school, religious education, or youth program.</u> Home-Schooling parents may submit their child's/children's entries without this preliminary review.
- <u>Deadline For Submission to Diocese</u>- Selected entries from schools, religious ed. or youth programs, or home-schooling parents must be <u>received at the Diocese by January 12, 2018</u>. Send entries to:

- Entries for each category will be judged on creativity, clarity of message, and visual appeal.
