Parents with children in our religious education program will receive their re-registration

forms <u>by mail</u> for the 2017-2018 school year the week of April 17th. Fourth and Fifth grades will only be a summer intensive program, June 26, 27, 28, 29 and July 5 and 6th from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm with returning classes for Advent and Lent; and our 1st grade program remains on Tuesday afternoons, from September thru December/mid-January (TBA), same time 4:30-6:00 pm.

Please make any necessary corrections, <u>SIGN</u> and return the form, including the non-refundable registration fee, <u>or</u> **promissory note (call to request) by May 31, 2017:**

(FOURTH AND FIFTH GRADE PARENTS PLEASE SEND IN ASAP.) SIGNED registrations ONLY will be accepted, for each child. If mailing please list to the "Attn: PREP office" on envelope. All 2nd, 3rd and 7th graders may hand it in to their teachers during their remaining classes. You may also drop it off to our church <u>REL ED</u> office (rear of church, first door on walkway, large parking lot) see registration times below. CLOSED FRIDAYS Fees increase June 1st thru June 29th, Absolutely no re-registrations will be taken after June 29th, your child will have to wait for the 2018-19 year.

NO REGISTRATIONS WILL BE TAKEN BY PHONE. PLEASE READ YOUR LETTERS CAREFULLY! NEW REGISTRANTS

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

- 1. Family <u>MUST</u> first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
- 2. Registration (in person) at the religious education office (Under the church).
- **3.** Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).
- 4. A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.

1 CHILD \$ 110.00 2 CHILDREN \$ 160.00

3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$ 190.00

- 5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
- 6. Grades 3 through 8 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
- 7. The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.

Gospel Today Easter Sunday of the Resurrection of the Lord | John 20:1-9

On Easter morning Mary Magdalene went to the tomb and found it empty. She hurried to get Peter and John. Peter entered first, and when John entered he "saw and believed." Jesus has risen!

Believe... Alleluia, Alleluia!

Choose a date and an Alpha and Omega... color the flame and choose a cross to color. Cut and glue all to the candle.

The Paschal or Easter Candle

Leologood

Each year at the Easter Vigil on Holy Saturday, a new fire is built and blessed. From this fire, a new Paschal Candle is lit for the first time and will be used for one year. Candle designs vary, but they are always white, the largest in the worship space and contain certain symbols - a cross, the Alpha and Omega and the date. Let's design our own candle by choosing, coloring and gluing on the designs you like. Do you see the Paschal Candle in your church?

- (1) THE CROSS Always the central symbol
- (2) THE ALPHA AND OMEGA Tells us God is the beginning and the end
- (3) THE CURRENT YEAR Says God is with us here and now
- (4) THE FLAME Reminds us Jesus is the Light of the World
- (5) Use **RED** to make 5 points on the cross to represent the 5 wounds of Jesus
