Catholic Social Services

<u>Diocesan Parish Counseling</u> <u>Services</u>: Parishioners have access to short-term

counseling (up to 6 sessions) at locations throughout the Diocese. The program was developed by Catholic Charities and the Diocese of Trenton. Licensed counseling professionals are available to help parishioners through difficult issues such as marital problems, raising children, eldercare, bereavement or the stress of job loss that can be successfully addressed by brief counseling support. Pastors and parish priests of the Diocese can refer parishioners to the parish counseling services.

<u>Parish Emergency Assistance Program</u> (PEAP): Emergency financial assistance to individuals through the parish and coordinated by Catholic Charities is available.

<u>Diocesan Social Service Workshops</u>: Information and resources to parishes and Catholic Social Service agencies are available to enhance Diocesan Catholic Social Service.

<u>Home Health Nursing Program</u>: Free, in-home nursing and home health services are available to Seniors in Greater Trenton through Mt. Carmel Guild.

Emergency Assistance: People in Mercer County are able to receive food through Mt. Carmel Guild. Over 30,000 received food through this program last year.





P.R.E.P. RE-REGISTRATION

Parents with children in our religious education program will receive their re-registration forms by mail for the 2017-2018 school year the week of April 17th.

Fourth and Fifth grades will only be a summer intensive program, June 26, 27, 28, 29 and July 5 and 6th from 8:30 am to 1:00 pm with returning classes for Advent and Lent; and our 1st grade program remains on Tuesday afternoons, from September thru December/mid-January (TBA), same time 4:30-6:00 pm.

Please make any necessary corrections, **SIGN** and return the form, including the non-refundable registration fee, or promissory note (call to request) by May 31, 2017:

(FOURTH AND FIFTH GRADE PARENTS PLEASE SEND IN ASAP.) SIGNED registrations ONLY will be accepted, for each child. If mailing please list to the "Attn: **PREP office" on envelope.** All 2nd, 3rd and 7th graders may hand it in to their teachers during their remaining classes. You may also drop it off to our church REL ED office (rear of church, first door on walkway, large parking lot) see registration times below. CLOSED FRIDAYS Fees increase June 1st thru June 29th. Absolutely no re-registrations will be taken after June 29th, your child will have to wait for the 2018-19 year.

NEW REGISTRANTS

To register NEW STUDENTS in our religious education program, the following requirements must be met:

- 1. Family MUST first be registered in Holy Family parish, at the rectory.
- 2. Registration (in person) at the religious education office (Under the church).
- 3. Copy of baptismal certificate for each child (even if baptized at Holy Family).
- A non-refundable registration fee as stated below for each child.

1 CHILD \$ 110.00 2 CHILDREN \$ 160.00 3 OR MORE CHILDREN \$ 190.00

- 5. A referral letter (proof of attendance) is required from a former parish for students transferring to our parish.
- 6. Grades 3 through 8 must also present proof of other sacraments they have made.
- The normal time to begin religious education is the year your child begins first grade.



Easter Food Basket Blessing In Church - 12 Noon - Saturday April 15

There is a custom in Poland for families to bring baskets of food to church to be blessed by the priest on Holy Saturday. We have

continued this custom here at Holy Family. There will be a blessing of food for the Easter meal on Sat. April 15th at 12 Noon (Holy

Saturday). The baskets usually contain colored eggs (that symbolize life, spring, and the Resurrection), sausage or ham (that represents the passion of Christ), bread or Babka (that represents Christ, who is the bread of life), horseradish (representing the passion of Christ), salt (symbolizing prosperity), and butter (that represents good will).

Fifth Sunday of Lent | John 11:1-45


